"All that part of Nyuka Cemetery formerly known as Lots 1138-1139-1257-1258-1259-1373-1374-1375-1376-1377-1378-1379-1493-1494-1495-1496-1497-1498-1499-1613-1614-1615-1616-1617-1618-1619-1734-1735-1736-1737-1738-1739-1855-1856-1857-1858-1859-1975-1976-1977-1978-1979-2094-2095-2096-2097-2098-2099-2214-2215-2216-2217-2218-2219. together with all the alleys or walks adjacent to said lots, and all of Drives H. I and J, lying north of the Park Drive, and all of Drive G lying north of Lot 1372 and west of the center of the 40 foot Curved drive."

If you have the description in quotation marks above Copied into the instrument of vacation it will cover the ground vacated for G. A. R. Cemetery

Sec, 8 Chap, 84 ( Title Soldiers &c , burial place.)-That a piece or parcel of land not exceeding in extent one acre not otherwise used or appropriated , in such place and in such form as shall be selected and agreed upon between the Trustees of Wyuka Cemetery , and a Committee to be selected by the Grand Army of the Republic of Lincoln Nebraska is hereby appropriated and dedicated , to the use and for the purpose of a Soldiers burying ground, said ground to be selected in the above described manner out of the south half of the east half, of the south east quarter, of tectiion nineteen in township no ten range seven east of the sixtg P. M. otherwise known as Wyuka Cemetery; and said plat of ground shall be used for the burial, of such honorably discharged Soldiers, Sailors , Marines, and Army Nurses as they or their friends shall desire to bury therein, together with such members of their immediate families as said Committee from the Grand Army of the Republic, shall direct.

Section 9 (Same control ) Said Soldiers burial ground shall be under the joint control, of the board of Trustees of Wyuka Cemetery and such Committee as shall be designated by the Grand Army of the Republic of Lincoln Nebraska, and shall at all times be subject to all rules and Regulations of Wyuka Cemetery. -----Rules and Regulations -----

Governing G.A.R. Cemetery,

1st, The Soldiers and Sailors burial ground in Wyuka Cemetery shall be under the control of nine Trustees, consisting of the three Trustees of Wyuka Cemetery who shall be exofficio members of said board, together with three members from each G.A.R. Post in the City , to be selected in a manner provided by said Posts,

2nd, The Officers of said board of Trustees shall consist of a President, Secretary, Treasurer and Superintendant, the President of the Board of Trustees of Wyuka Cemetery shall be Exofficio President of this board.

3rd, The annual meetings of said board shall be held on the second tuesday in January at which meeting the board shall reorganize for the ensuing year, and arrange for such additional meetings as it shall consider necessary or expedient,

4th , The President, secretary and Treasurer shall perform the usual and ordinary duties of like Officers in similar boards,

5th, The Superintendant shall have the sole and exclusive charge of the grounds, , and the issuing of burial permits, but in case of a disagreement between the applicant, for a burial permit , and the Superintendant, he shall forthwith call a meeting of the board of

Trustees, a majority of whom shall be sufficient to decide the matter  
6th, The board shall have power to amend, add, to , or change above rules at any regular or annual meeting, or at any called meeting , upon each member being notified in writing, two weeks in advance of said meeting as to the exact amendment or change contemplated

A N A C T

Appropriating and setting aside certain lands in Wyuka C Cemetery as a burial place for deceased Union Soldiers of the War of the Rebellion.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEBRASKA.

SECTION I. That a piece or parcel of land not exceeding in extent one acre not otherwise used or appropriated, in such place and in such form as shall be selected and agreed upon between the trustees of Wyuka cemetery, and a committee to be selected by the Grand Army of the Republic of Lincoln, Nebraska, is hereby appropriated and dedicated to the use and for the purpose of a soldiers' burial ground, said grounds to


